



ARPL Process

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Step 1 -Interview and Assessment

Candidate attends an interview with the SME Assessor. This consist of an interview and the following assessment: -

- Knowledge Assessment
- Practical Assessment

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Step 2- GAP Training

If the SME Assessor found any GAPS during the interview training needs to be done in the area identified.

Candidate will attend training as per scheduled, training will consist of Knowledge and practical application.

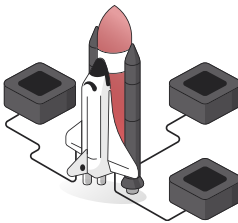
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Step 3- Re Assessment of GAPS

Candidate will be re-assessed on the GAPS should the candidate be deemed competent he/she can now be recommended for Trade Test.

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Step 4: Submission of Application

Trade test assessment centre will submit candidate application to QCTO/NAMB with all supporting documents. Trade Test assessment centre will do the required verification before submission eg verification of employment

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Step 5: QCTO/NAMB feedback

QCTO/NAMB will give feedback to the trade test assessment centre on whether the candidate met the requirements to attempt his/her trade test. The candidate will receive a unique serial number to attempt the trade test. Candidate will receive a letter informing the candidate of the serial number and trade test dates



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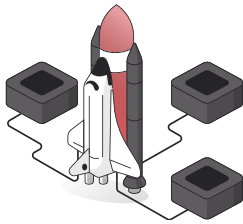
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Step 6-Prep Training

Prep Training will be conducted

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Step 7- Trade Test

Candidate will attempt his/her trade test. This is conducted over a period of two days. You have three attempts at your trade test. A no-show is taken as your first attempt

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Documents Required to be submitted :

- Highest School Qualification
- Rigging service letters (Applicant must have more than 3 years' experience in the industry as a semi-skilled rigger/rigger assistant)
- ID Document
- All service letters must have contactable references telephone numbers and email address
